The meeting started at 6:00 PM with only two board members in attendance . The quarterline road concerns were discussed from 6:00 PM until 7:00 PM .

Mike Klopchin called the meeting to order at 6:20 PM with three select board members present .

During the meeting there was no board action taken .

Ambrose moved to adjourned at 7:00 PM - second by Ruane. The motion passed unanimously.

The following record represents a paraphrase summary of the one hour of discussion.

Ambrose reminded the attendees that the purpose of the meeting was to share information and plan a presentation for the Rutland Town Board regarding the Quarterline road.

Klopchin reported that he was unable to find a VT state procedure for who is required to maintain a road after its creation .

Ruane outlined the actions that would have to be taken to upgrade the North portion of the dirt road to facilitate easier maintenance. He also answered questions regarding the cost of minimal improvements to facilitate easier travel.

Ruane emphasized that Clarendon should not be responsible for maintaining a road that belongs to Rutland Town.

Theresa Miele distributed a handout that contains information and facts that various Quarterline citizens have researched. (Attached)

The majority of the discussion centered on the various needs to have the road minimally maintained,
access for emergency vehicles
access for delivery of packages - UPS, fedex, local prescriptions majority
Quarterline Rd is used by many towns for both north and south traffic
access for US mail delivery

Rutland Town has agreed to meet with us on July 20th at 6:00 PM. all of the Quarterline residents agreed to attend. There was universal agreement that the tenor of the approach to Rutland Town should be one of requesting help from a good neighbor.
